Menaul School is accredited by Cognia. It is a member of the National Association for College Admissions Counseling (NACAC) and the Rocky Mountain Association for College Admission Counseling (RMACAC).

SCHOOL DESCRIPTION AND MISSION

Menaul School is a coeducational, independent day and boarding school founded in 1896 in what was then the Territory of New Mexico. Established by the Presbyterian Church to educate an underserved population, Menaul remains committed to preparing students for success in mind, body, and spirit. The school currently enrolls students in grades six through twelve and offers a post-graduate program.

In 2016, Menaul School expanded its mission globally by opening its first international campus, Menaul School Qingdao, in China. Together, the two campuses operate under the Menaul School Education Service Agency, collaborating to provide life-changing educational opportunities to students from New Mexico and around the world.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS


All Menaul School students take a college preparatory curriculum in the liberal arts tradition. More than **95 percent** of students complete at least one AP course, and the **average student takes 3-4 AP courses**. **17 AP courses** are currently offered across a wide range of disciplines. All students enrolled in an AP course **must** take the corresponding examination. **72 percent of our faculty** hold advanced degrees in their field.

Menaul School students are required to earn **29 credits**, including 4 English, 4 Social Studies, 3.5 Mathematics, 3.5 Science, 2 Fine and Performing Arts, 2 Physical Education and Athletics, 2 Religion and Philosophy, 2 Community Life, and 6 Elective credits. **Menaul School exceeds the State of New Mexico's requirements by five credits.**

DIVERSITY

Menaul School is **New Mexico's most diverse school**, a majority-minority community in which no single ethnic group comprises more than 27 percent of the student body. Forty-one percent of students are the **first in their families to attend college**. Admission is selective, and 75 percent of students receive financial aid based on need and merit. Menaul School admissions works to support diversity in all forms, including racial, ethnic, socioeconomic, national, linguistic, educational, and religious.

GRADING SYSTEM AND EVALUATION

Menaul School faculty evaluate student work on a rigorous basis. **All major assess**ments are completed in class, on paper, without access to internet-connected devices or generative **Al tools.** Each semester concludes with comprehensive, multi-part final examinations that account for 20 percent of the semester grade.

GRADE WEIGHTING AND HONORS

Menaul School uses a weighted 4.0 grading scale. Students earning a GPA of 3.25 or higher are named to the Honor Roll, and those with a GPA of 3.75 or higher are named to the **President's Honor Roll**. Departmental academic prizes are awarded annually. Students who maintain a GPA of at least 3.5 and complete two or more credits beyond the minimum graduation requirement in a single discipline are designated as **Distinguished Scholars** in that discipline.

COMMUNITY AND RESIDENTIAL LIFE

Menaul School seeks to develop well-rounded students prepared for leadership and service. Upper school students complete **70 hours of community service** prior to graduation. Participation in athletics is widespread and integral to school life. Weekly Chapel services and a faculty-led Advisory curriculum provide moral and ethical guidance. Student organizations and academic teams are active in state and national competitions. Work-experience internships with school departments offer students practical skills and an understanding of institutional responsibility. The Residential Life program emphasizes respect, understanding, and communication within a community representing **28 countries and territories** and **five Native American nations**.

SIGNATURE PROGRAMS

Menaul School maintains the Menaul Historical Library and Research Center, a Presbyterian archival collection staffed by alumni and volunteers. The Center provides students with opportunities to study historical preservation and conduct primary research on campus. Menaul School also sponsors the Southwest's leading scholastic fencing program, directed by a three-time U.S. Olympian and national champion and organized along NCAA standards.
